KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL NAMES NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

INDIANAPOLIS – The Kiwanis International Board of Trustees has announced the appointment of Eyjólfur “Eddie” Sigurdsson as the organization’s next Executive Director. He will succeed the current Executive Director, A.G. Terry Shaffer, upon Shaffer’s retirement.

Sigurdsson has been a Kiwanian for more than 31 years. Initially, he joined the Kiwanis Club in Reykjavík-Hekla in his native Iceland in 1964 and served as its president from 1970-71. He is currently a member of the Destelbergen-

Reinaert, Belgium club. Sigurdsson has served in a variety of leadership capacities with Kiwanis including 1982-83 Kiwanis International-European Federation President, 1988-93 Kiwanis International Trustee, 1989-90 Kiwanis International Foundation Trustee, and 1995-96 Kiwanis International President. Currently he is general director of the Regional Service Center – Europe.

Sigurdsson also owned a printing, publishing, and bookstore operation in Iceland.

Transition arrangements are being made. In the meantime, Shaffer, who was appointed Executive Director in 1994, continues to serve in that capacity.

DID YOU KNOW?

This is a picture of the new sign at the Kiwanis monument in the Huron National Forest. River Road, which runs from Oscoda to M-65, has been designated a "Scenic Highway" and the Forestry Department asked the Kiwanis Club of Tawas to upgrade the sign at the memorial to match the signage at other locations on the highway. The Kiwanis Club of Tawas had \$2,500.00 in a Memorial Fund that they applied to the sign, and asked the Kiwanis Club of Oscoda to provide the additional \$500.00 needed to meet the \$3,000.00 cost of the new sign. The sign was installed this spring, and provides



an attention getter for the memorial. The Monument, which is located on Monument Road, just south of its junction with River Road at the site of the Lumbermen's Monument, commemorates the Michigan District of Kiwanis donating \$19,400.00 towards replanting the AuSable River Valley. The donated funds purchased 2 million pine tree plantings, which were planted in the current Huron Nation Forest in 1928 and 1929. The Kiwanis Clubs of Tawas and Oscoda invite all Kiwanians who are in the area to visit the memorial.
