## Rick's Outlook — A Message from the Executive Director

### INT'L CONVENTION CERTIFICATION

Registering for the International Convention does not guarantee voting privileges. You must also be certified as a Delegate. Once you register, you will be sent a Delegate Certification form. This form must be filled out (one per club), signed by the President and Secretary and sent to Kiwanis International by April 30, 2004.

### SPONSORED PROGRAM FUND

Our Sponsored Program Fund (Circle K, Key Club, Builders Club, K-Kids and Aktion Club) clubs continue to excel and requires the support of all clubs in the Michigan District. A request was mailed in September 2003 and is available on-line at [www.michigankiwanis.org](http://www.michigankiwanis.org) asking for participation in this fund that supports our sponsored organizations through their District activities. To date we have 64% (\$11,869) of the budgeted amount of \$18,550 with only 103 clubs responding. Get your checks in now so these sponsored organizations have the financial support they need.

### CLUB ELECTIONS & REPORTING

Your Club should have a nominating committee in operation, and club elections should take place between the first week of April and the second week of May. Complete your annual Report of Club Elections immediately following the elections. The form must be mailed to K.I. and to the District Office by June 1, 2004. These reports allow the smooth transition of leadership and the

main means of communication from both K.I. and the District Office, as they are essential to develop the directories that are so heavily relied on.

### RESOLUTIONS and BY-LAWS

Clubs wishing to submit proposed District Resolutions or By-Law changes must have them into the District Office no later than June 26, 2004. A copy of resulting Resolutions and By-Law changes will be mailed to each club by July 26, 2004.

## CHIP-IN FOR CHILDREN

Mike Riordan, Club President reports that the Allen Park Kiwanians have started a new project to help buy special supplies for Children's Hospital of Michigan, Detroit after Laurie Dayton, Child Life Coordinator visited their Club. "CHIP-IN FOR CHILDREN" raises funds by the sale of donated Frito-Lay potato chips and similar individual portioned snacks to other Clubs in Division 5 and at Allen Park civic events.

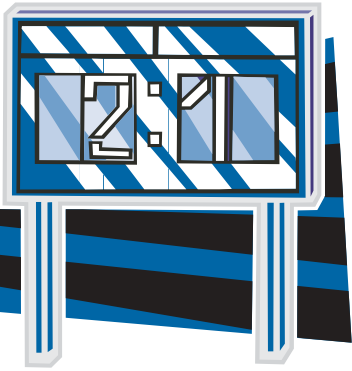

### How Are We Doing?

We are OK so far, checks have gone to the KMF Hospital Projects on schedule and we have funds for at least the next three months in the bank. Club donations stand at 59.8% of the year's goal. The bad news is that the District's membership continues to decline and with it KMF contributions from Clubs.

Trustees have to set next years budget by May. It won't be easy!

### MI-Foundation's Purpose and Objectives

This is not new information. However, I continue to get questions about the MI-Foundation's purpose and objectives. We help Hospitalized Michigan Kids. We differ from other charitable organizations in that **our support is for education, recreation and non-medical activities that aid recovery or development of child patients.** Many clubs exceed their support of the KMF Projects extra donations or by a donation to a specific project (which usually is not counted in MI-Foundation numbers.) This edition reports in the following articles on going the extra mile in supporting our hospital projects.
