Cancellations must be made by 3:00 PM the day before arrival to avoid no show penalties. Our Kiwanis Convention rate is guaranteed from 3 days prior to the Convention to 3 days after the Convention.

87th Michigan Kiwanis District Convention

The 2004 District convention activities will begin on Thursday, August 26 with registration, credentials and displays starting at 3:00 PM. The Kiwanis Clubs of Division 4 host this year's convention at the magnificent Hyatt Regency.

Early Friday morning is the latest you will want to arrive in order to take advantage of several workshops and participate in the hearings on proposed resolutions and proposed by-law changes that will be presented at the business sessions of the convention.

Friday at noon is the official Convention Kick-off Luncheon, which is open to everyone. The meeting will include an address by R. Thomas Vildibill, Sr., Past Distinguished Governor (2000-01) for the CA.-Nev.-Hawaii Kiwanis District (The largest in Kiwanis International). He is sure to motivate you as he has for so many other Kiwanians, setting the tone for the convention.

Following lunch, the first business (delegate) session will begin at 2:00 PM. The session includes a report and voting on resolutions, and your Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation will have their annual meeting. In addition, you will have the opportunity to hear from the candidates running for Governor-Elect and Governor, with Division caucuses wrapping up the session.

Friday evening brings the traditional "Fun Night-Picnic With Henry & Clara Ford" with a

short bus ride (less than two miles) beginning at 6:00PM to the Historic Henry Ford Estate. Once there you will enjoy a great picnic dinner (see meals menu on page 7) and it is rumored that Henry and Clara Ford may stop by for a short visit. You also will have the opportunity to tour the power plant. Additionally, you can take a ride in a Model T and get your picture taken for a nominal fee. Other items are still under consideration to ensure everyone has fun and a relaxing good time.

Saturday starts with the Road Runners Breakfast-open to everyone. Binh Rybacki, founder of "Children of Peace" and a Kiwanian will give an inspiring account of this organizations focus on orphaned Viet Nam kids-This year's Governor's project. Governor Chuck Nagy will present Binh with the District-wide funds collected during this last year. Following breakfast, a well-planned workshop series by next year's District leadership will provide many educational and informative tips for all Kiwanians.

The Noon Honors and Awards luncheon will recognize clubs and individuals who have achieved special accomplishments during the year. Saturday at 2:30 PM, the second business (delegate) session will begin where we vote on by-law changes, nominate and vote for our District candidates, and learn all the details about next year's conventions in Hawaii and Battle Creek.

reception at 6:15 PM. A South Lansing Kiwanian-Brenda Spenny, a singer will supply the entertainment and the Governor's State of the District address is the only official business, so just like Friday night, plan on another comforting good time with Kiwanis friends.

A highlight of our District convention is the Prayer Breakfast and Memorial Service on Sunday morning, where you can pay tribute to those Kiwanians who have passed away during the past year and every year of our Michigan District history. Reverend Wilkes "Doc" O'Brien of the Cherry Hill Presbyterian Church will deliver our devotional message. After breakfast we will adjourn to the closing session where the current District Chairs and Officers will be retired and the new 2004/2005 leaders will be installed.

As the final action at the closing of the convention, we will draw the individual winners who have visited our exhibitor's in accordance with the rules.

While most everyone will be on their way home from a terrific convention late Sunday morning, the 2004/2005 District Board will hold their first meeting, ensuring that by Oct. 1, we will have another picture perfect conversion of leadership.
